The Summer Scholars program funds Tufts undergraduates to pursue ten-week independent research projects in which each student works closely with a faculty mentor to create a poster that s/he will present at a poster session in the fall. Summer Scholars then present the next stage of their research at a public forum on campus. Often, the summer project will culminate in the student's [Senior Honors Thesis](#).

The application consists of the following sections:

- A series of short-answer questions
- A 1-2 page CV or resume
- A copy of your transcript(s)
- A brief abstract, in accessible language, free from jargon or acronyms (100 words or fewer)
- A 750-word project proposal that you author yourself
- A letter of collaboration, co-authored with your faculty mentor
- A signed copy of the [Program Requirements](#)
- Two letters of recommendation, sent directly to anne.moore@tufts.edu

Eligibility:

- Tufts undergraduates in their second or third year at the time of application
- Minimum GPA of 3.0

Students and faculty are each limited to **one application**.

You may go back and change previous answers at any point while working on this application.

- What will be your research methods? (Interviews: Who are you interviewing and why? Textual analysis: What texts do you plan to read, and how? Experiments: What's your experimental design? Artistic practice: describe your process.)
- What's at stake in your project? What larger issue or question are you hoping to address, and/or what new knowledge are you helping to create/discover?
- What is the anticipated product of your research? (e.g. the literature review section of your senior thesis, an academic paper that you plan to present at a conference, a performance or series of performances, a documentary film or video)
